REMINDER: TARGETED BOIL WATER ADVISORY ISSUED FOR SPEEDWAY

August 10, 2008 – As a result of a water main break on Friday, Speedway officials want to remind residents that they remain under a TARGETED boil water advisory. The water main break in the vicinity of Lincoln Avenue and Cadillac Drive was repaired early Friday evening. However, officials are asking residents to boil water until further notice. The Town's Water Department continues to conduct testing this weekend and will continue on Monday. The Town will lift the Advisory as soon as possible.

Town of Speedway representatives will canvass the neighborhood door-to-door to notify residents when the advisory is lifted. Also, the area water lines have been flushed out, but residents should allow the tap water to run clear before any use—including boiling.

Residents in the following areas are impacted:

- West 16th Street, West of Cunningham
- Cadillac Drive
- Mickley, from 16th to Cadillac
- Lincoln Avenue
- Buick Drive
- Desoto Lane
- Nash Lane
- Crosley Lane

Town Manager Barbara Lawrence noted, "We appreciate the patience and understanding of Speedway residents impacted by this water main break, and apologize for any inconvenience as we make these important repairs to allow us to continue to provide safe drinking water."

Boiling –Water should be purified by boiling. In this method, bring the water to a full boil for at least five (5) minutes. Cool and aerate the boiled water by pouring it through the air from one clean container to another, or mixing rapidly with a clean utensil. Aeration will reduce the flat taste caused by boiling.

Use only SAFE water for the following purposes:

- Drinking, cooking, making baby formula, coffee, juices, other beverages or ice. Watering pets.
- Washing ready to eat fruits and vegetables
- Bathing infants, washing open wounds, or brushing teeth.
- Rinsing dishes (or you may add 1 Tablespoon of bleach to 2 gallons of tap water)
- DO NOT use ice cubes from your freezer or any beverages that that were made with unsafe

While under the advisory, you may use your current (unboiled/non-treated) water for the following:

- Bathing (except infants), showering and washing hands. You can use this water for washing dishes, although the final rinse for dishes or bathing must be with boiled water.
- Washing dishes in an automatic dishwasher that uses a heating element to dry dishes.
- Washing cars and watering lawns.

Safe water must be used until you get the “ALL CLEAR”

- Commercially bottled water
- Packaged ice from an approved source is safe.
- Water that has been at a rolling boil for 5 minutes.
